



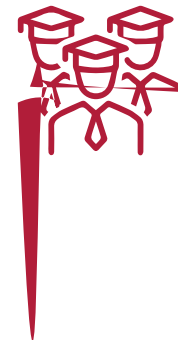

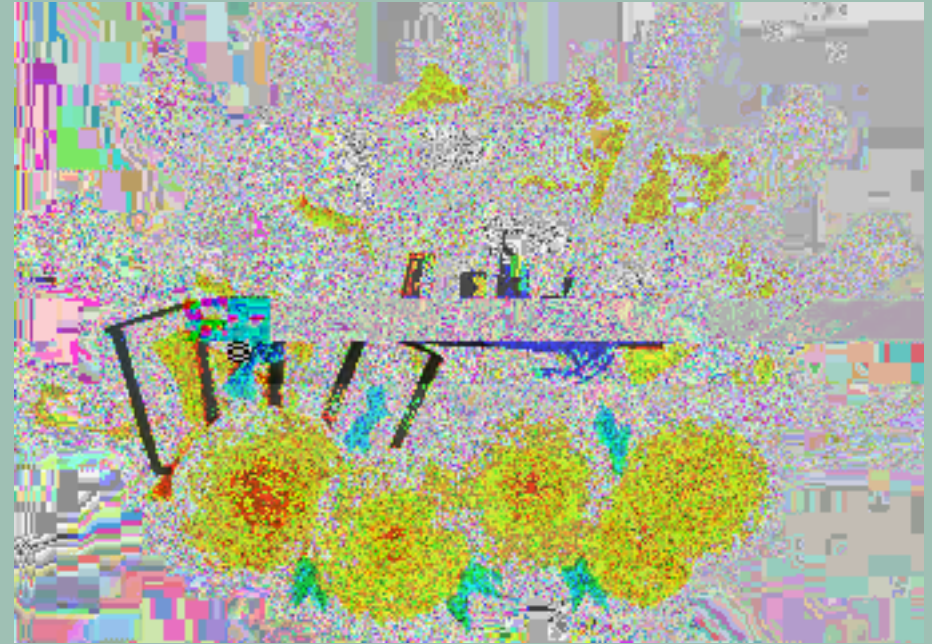


Cities, Regions, Planning (BES)

Global Geography (BA)

Global Geography explores how human societies and physical environments are deeply connected and constantly changing. Students learn how to analyze global processes including urbanization, uneven development and inequality, migration and identity formation, and environmental change.

Environmental Science (BSc)

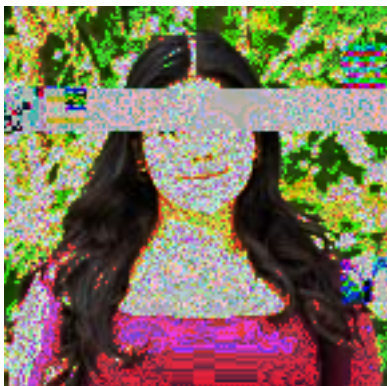

Experiential Education

Experiential Education is a hands-on approach to learning in which you participate in practical activities in the classroom, community, and workplace. EUC offers 40+ undergraduate courses with an experiential education component and offers the Cross-Campus Capstone Classroom or C4 to provide students with an opportunity to work effectively in interdisciplinary teams on real-world challenges with social impact.

Las Nubes EcoCampus in Costa Rica

Our EcoCampus located in Costa Rica supports the protection of the biological, ecological, and social values of the Las Nubes Biological Reserve. Students can travel to the EcoCampus while earning credits towards their degree.

Maloca Community Garden

The Maloca Community Garden is a space for all members of the University community to experience, from growing their own food to taking courses. Maloca Community Garden is a great setting for sustainable teaching and holding special outdoor events.

Co-op & Work Placements

Our Co-op Program provides students with the chance to integrate their classroom learning with practical, hands-on experience throughout their degree. By the end of the degree program, students will have completed at least two separate periods of work for a total of 12 to 16 months of paid employment experience. Fourth-year undergraduate students can earn degree credits through these placements, facilitated by community partners like The City of Toronto and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA).

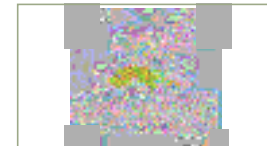
Student Life & Services
